What is a Working Tree? Many trees have jobs they perform, just like people! Some perform many jobs at the same time. Like people trees come in all shapes and sizes. Some tree shapes look triangular, square, circular, weeping, fat, short, tall and skinny. Look out in your neighborhood and draw some of the different tree shapes that you see.

Working Trees that produce air, food, medicine and soil additives are **The Spruce-it-up Team, Granny Smith, Dr. Yew Remedy and Hack & Berry.** All trees are important in making oxygen (this is what we need to breathe) for the whole planet.

Working Trees that protect and shelter us from the elements (snow, rain, wind, sun) are **Al Pine, Gusty Buster and Mr. Cool.** Some trees (like **Elmer Critterhouse**) not only protect us from the environment, but they give shelter as a home for animals, birds and insects. These are just a few examples of what trees can do for you, in your own neighborhood. Make a list of what kind of jobs you think that your trees are doing.

All trees have their own special beauty. Some flower, some change colors, some dance in the wind and some keep their foliage (leaves or needles) all year long. When these trees are in your neighborhood they make it beautiful, too! Make a list of the different colors of flowers and leaves you see in your neighborhood.
